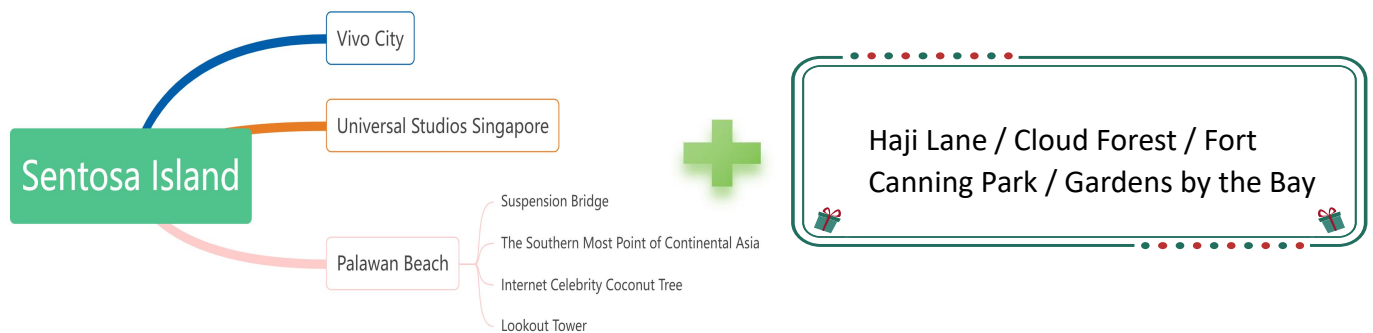

Splash Tribe, Sentosa's premier family-friendly beach hub, beckons with its sandcastle-themed water playground while adults can luxuriate by the infinity-edge pool. Just a stone's throw away, gear up for high-octane excitement at HyperDrive, Asia's top-tier gamified electric Go-Kart circuit. For a gentler pace, the UltraGolf beachside mini golf course offers imaginative landscapes for friendly competition. If you're looking for some wet 'n' wild fun, slide up and down the island's latest water-theme attraction - Hydrodash.



Meanwhile, The Palawan Dog Run is a delightful playground for our four-legged companions. As the sun dips, immerse yourself in luxury at +Twelve, the ultimate beach club experience with terraced cabanas, an infinity pool, and pulsating rhythms from top DJs. And when hunger calls, The Palawan Food Trucks stand ready with a myriad of global flavours.

Haji Lane

Haji Lane is a spot that just grabs you the minute you stumble onto it. It's this little strip tucked in Kampong Glam, and it's got some serious life to it—bright colors everywhere, wild stuff on the walls, and a vibe that's not like the rest of the city. You've got these old shophouses that have been there forever, but now they're splashed with murals that make you stop and stare. Haji Lane's where you'll find cool little shops and cafes crammed together, and it's got this mix of old history and new energy that's hard to beat. If you're new to Singapore or just need a break from the usual, Haji Lane in Singapore is where it's at.

Fort Canning Park

Fort Canning Park is one of Singapore's most historic landmarks. It has witnessed Singapore's golden age, when Malay Kings ruled from its peak, and watched as the island transformed from a sleepy fishing village into a vibrant trading hub in the 19th century. During World War II, the hill was instrumental in Singapore's war efforts with numerous military buildings located there. One of these buildings was the Fort Canning



Bunker or Battle Box, where the decision to surrender Singapore to the Japanese was made by the British. Many war relics from Singapore's colourful history have survived on the hill and are still visible today. Although the hill has since lost its imposing stature, its distinctive charm still remains. The lush lawns draw picnics, concerts, theatre productions and festivals, while weddings, parties and gatherings are a regular sight in the park's elegant indoor function rooms.

Gardens by the Bay

Gardens by the Bay is a sprawling natural park that covers 101 hectares (about 250 acres) in the Central Region of Singapore, right next to the Marina Reservoir. This park is divided into three distinct waterfront gardens: Bay South Garden in Marina South, Bay East Garden in Marina East, and Bay Central Garden in Downtown Core and Kallang. The largest among them is Bay South Garden, which spans 54 hectares (approximately 130 acres) and was designed by Grant Associates.



The complex within Gardens by the Bay consists of two temperature-controlled conservatories:

the Flower Dome and the Cloud Forest, strategically positioned along the Marina Reservoir shoreline. These conservatories, designed by WilkinsonEyre and Grant Associates, serve as impressive demonstrations of sustainable building techniques and offer an all-weather educational and entertainment space within the gardens. Each of these structures is quite spacious, covering around 2.5 acres, and the Flower Dome holds the distinction of being the world's largest glasshouse without interior support columns.

Once you're here, you'll just cry in endless admiration for all the beauty and technological advancement. They constantly bring in seasonal flowers and plants from all over the world and you get to enjoy all this in the comfort of cool temperature and humidity.

Cloud Forest

Home to one of the world's tallest indoor waterfalls and a lush mountain clad with plants from around the world, Cloud Forest rewards the curious and adventurous. Go on a fascinating journey of discovery and get up close with some of the world's most exotic plant species as you stroll along its unique aerial walkways.
